Our community came together to share our thoughts and dreams for the boulevard – in the hopes that our vision might provide some stewardship for the upcoming development process.

We are working to grow our thriving community in a sustainable way, balancing the needs of the environment with our ambitious social, cultural and economic goals.

We see opportunity for Colonel Nase Boulevard development to be sensitive to the environment, complementary to our existing commercial area, and standardized to result in a high quality addition to our community. We envision businesses and services that the whole community will benefit from, and that will both accommodate and spur growth.

The boulevard will...

- Be the main arterial link between Routes 7 and 177
- Open up over 400 acres of development land
- Represent an additional access to the road to Fredericton and Saint John
- Offer links to the Trans Canada Highway and the northeastern US
- Feature a wide corridor with bike lanes, landscaped sidewalks and designated activity areas
- Provide roadside commercial development opportunities
- Increase multiple residential development
- Showcase businesses with highway visibility, close to Route 7 ramp access
- Include flexible mixed-use zoning
- Be ready for growth in a welcoming community
